
A series of paintings entitled Feynman a-z




Series Description:

A series of paintings entitled The Fish






Series Description:


The 2023 series called: Sigma. All paintings are acrylic on canvas, size 50x50, framed.



Series Description:

A complex series that aims to combine a colorful and stylistic meanings with mathematical symbols from the financial world. Describing the series as a whole is difficult because each image represents a different equation or operator. This is the description of the last image in this portfolio: The Red Line. "The Red Line is a work that unfolds on a canvas adorned with a dramatic interplay of black and gold. At its core is a profound equation wrapped in layers of meaning and emotion. Against the black and gold backdrop, a bold red line stands out, symbolizing the visceral emotion of fear. The equation itself is a poignant representation of the human experience - a journey through fear and the transformative power of taking a single step forward. The equation, with its unknown variable represented by the red line, is a symbolic representation of the enigmatic nature of fear. The transformative element, however, lies in the addition of a singular constant: plus 1. This represents the bold step, the decisive action that transcends fear. It signifies the power of taking that one decisive step forward that transcends the boundaries of fear.

Series Description:

In this triptych series titled "Lament of Light," the central motif of an inverted lambda symbolizes the enigmatic nature of reality as perceived through the lens of quantum mechanics

Panel One: "Entangled Realities"

The first panel captures the inversion of the vectors against a backdrop of uncertainty, symbolizing the entanglement of societal norms and the elusive nature of truth within contemporary society.

Panel Two: "The Uncertainty Principle"

In the second panel, the inverted lambda emerges amidst a maelstrom of uncertainty, symbolizing the pervasive ambiguity and indterminacy that characterizes the human experience.

Panel Three: "Quantum Liberation"

Through this panel, the series offers a vision of quantum liberation, celebrating the transformative power of individual action.

In "Lament of Light," the triptych serves as a profound critique of society, challenging viewers to reexamine their perceptions of reality through the lens of quantum mechanics while also highlighting the urgent need to confront systemic injustices and work towards a more equitable future.

The 2024 painting called: Post -peasant, acrylic on canvas, size 200x200, framed.



Description:

"Post-Peasant" is a large-scale painting that encapsulates symbolism and criticism of social dynamics in Slovakia. At the center of the painting is the icy motif of a peasant who boldly declares, "All are lesser than me". This statement is symbolically represented by the expression ≥ 0 , which signifies a sense of superiority and dominance. The motive of the farmer represents the rigid, unyielding nature of such attitudes, frozen in their convictions and unwilling to consider alternative perspectives. The use of the symbol of inequality (\geq) reinforces the hierarchical mindset in which some perceive themselves as inherently superior to others.

Through "Post-peasant," the artist highlights the dangers of arrogance and narrowmindedness within society and urges viewers to challenge such attitudes and embrace empathy, humility, and openness to diverse perspectives.
